HAITI is a sovereign state that shares the island of Hispaniola with Dominican Republic and boasts the second longest coastline in the Greater Antilles. The capital city, Port-au-Prince, is home to 2.6 million people.

We have been rescuing hopeless children in Haiti since 2002 and we opened our first children's home in the northern city of Cap-Hatien two years later. In addition to the children's home, we operate a school for residential children as well as those in the surrounding area. Today, over 150 children attend the school. We also provide nutritious lunches and after-school tutoring to help students stay nourished and on track.

Interesting facts about Haiti

- Country's population is almost entirely descended from African slaves
- More than half of Haitians are Roman Catholic
- First Caribbean nation to have their soccer team qualify for the World Cup finals

COVID-19 in Haiti: With the current school closures, we have sent homework to our non-residential students along with food for their families. We are continuing to offer limited classes for our residential students, but the biggest struggles right now involve access to resources. Most of our goods come from the US and Dominican Republic, but borders are often closed. The price of food has once again spiked and common products are now scarce. We are still providing bags of rice, oil, and spaghetti for families in our community, and have served hundreds of families in the past six months.
